Krakow Climate City Contract

- The current work on the Climate Contract is focused on preparing large-scale projects to address the 21% emissions gap in the city.
- This gap remains primarily in sectors related to electricity and heat generation for buildings.
- To achieve this, we are conducting consultations with various stakeholders - representatives from universities, ministries, businesses, and other departments of the Krakow City Office.
- As Polish cities, we largely face the same challenges. Therefore, we aim to base our work on strong cooperation (similarly to Spanish cities) with the other 4 Polish cities of the Cities Mission - Warsaw, Wroclaw, Lodz, and Rzeszow. We are striving to develop similar projects and rely on uniform emission calculators to make our message stronger and united.

Goal of Krakow by 2030

The aim of the European Cities Mission is to develop a plan to reduce emissions by 80% by 2030. Such a target is also adopted by Krakow.

Current situation

The work on the Climate City Contract is currently a top priority. It is assumed that existing policies, strategies, and actions can reduce emissions at best by 59%. However, this still leaves a 21% emissions gap that must be addressed with new actions.

III: Art. 15a reform EMD

Right to energy sharing
(...)
Member States shall ensure that active customers participating in energy sharing:

- 1) are entitled to have the shared electricity injected into the grid deducted from their total metered consumption within a time interval no longer than the imbalance settlement period and without prejudice to applicable non-discriminatory taxes, levies and cost-effective network charges;
- 2) benefit from all consumer rights and obligations as final customers under this Directive;
- 3) are not required to comply with supplier obligations (...) up to 10.8 kW single households, and 50 kW multi-apartment blocks;
- 4) have access to voluntary template contracts with fair and transparent terms and conditions for energy sharing agreements (...);
- 5) are not subject to unfair and discriminatory treatment by market participants or their balance responsible parties; (...)


